Greetings

Dear readers!

The second quarter of 2018 was marked by the successful Central Asian International Environmental Forum. The event is held on the initiative of CAREC with the support of the governments of Central Asian countries, CAREC is the secretariat of CAIEF.

This year the forum was held on June 5-8 in Tashkent, Uzbekistan. It was held for the second time, the first CAIEF was held in 2017 in Ashgabat, Turkmenistan. The purpose of these forums is to strengthen cooperation in the field of environmental protection and sustainable development, both at the regional and cross-sectoral levels.

The countries of Central Asia have similar environmental problems, which are mostly transboundary in nature, such as reducing biological diversity, deteriorating water and air quality, degrading arable land and pastures, generating solid household and industrial waste, as well as risks of climate vulnerability and natural disasters. In this regard, it is nec-

essary to recognize the importance of regional cooperation. As noted in various studies, the potential of the partnership of the countries of Central Asia is assessed very highly.

Separately, I would like to note that within the forum, there was an official opening of CAREC-TIIAME Innovations and Scientific Research Cluster on the issues of water resources management. This is the first centre of knowledge on water issues in Central Asia. The main objectives of the cluster: the transfer of experience in the implementation of the projects, scientific research, as well as capacity development. Emphasis will be placed on practical skills: presentation, negotiation, work with documentation, preparation of scientific publications. In addition, the tasks of the cluster will include the search for new approaches in the financing of science. Involvement of private investors, international grants and government funding.

A lot of CAREC activities were carried out within the framework of projects, in this quarterly newsletter we tried to touch upon each one.



We hope that we will be able to fully inform our readers about the efforts of CAREC to preserve and restore our common environment!

Central Asian International Environmental Forum 2018

400 participants, 50 international and regional organizations, 18 reports and more than 70 presentations!

On June 5-8 the Central Asian International Environmental Forum (CAIEF) was held in Tashkent, where the issues of strengthening cooperation in the field of environmental protection and sustainable development were discussed at the regional level.

The forum was organized by the State Committee of the Republic of Uzbekistan on Ecology and Environmental Protection and the Regional Environmental Centre for Central Asia with the support of UNDP, European Union, World Bank, USAID and OSCE.

The forum became the second in a row. The first event was held in 2017 in Ashgabat (Turkmenistan); it is initiated and organized by the Regional Environmental Centre for Central Asia with the support of the governments of Central Asia.

About 400 people from various countries participated in CAIEF 2018. Including the representatives of more than 50 international and regional organizations.



The following events were organized within the forum in Tashkent: 6 plenary and 9 parallel sessions on 3 main topics – conservation of biodiversity and development of a network of protected natural areas, integrated management of solid domestic waste, renewable energy and energy efficiency. The discussions on main topics included 3 directions: the legal and institutional framework; scientific cooperation and best practices; public-private partnership.

The forum became a platform for the first specialized International exhibition "Green Ecology Technologies Central Asia – GETCA 2018" and for the Business Forum on Green Ecology Technologies.

Also, International Conference on "Joint Actions to Mitigate the Consequences of the Aral Sea Catastrophe: New Approaches, Innovative Solutions, Investments" was held within CAIEF 2018.

The forum allowed informing the participants on the trends at the global, regional and national levels. Participants also explored opportunities to strengthen regional cooperation and formulated joint actions in the context of achieving SDGs for Central Asia.

Opening of CAREC-TIIAME Innovations and Scientific Research Cluster

On June 8 the Tashkent Institute of Irrigation and Agricultural Mechanization Engineers (TI-IAME) hosted the opening ceremony of Innovation and Scientific Research Cluster in the field of water management, the first in Central Asia. The cluster is established with the support of the Regional Environmental Centre for Central Asia.

The popularization of scientific activities among young people and development of critical thinking skills" said the TIIAME rector professor Uktam Umurzakov.



The opening ceremony was attended by the Minister of Water Resources of Uzbekistan Shavkat Khamraev, Minister of Higher and Secondary Education of Uzbekistan Inom Mazhidov, Minister of innovative development of Uzbekistan Ibrokhim Abdurahmonov, as well as more than a hundred members of CAIEF 2018. CAREC Executive Director Dr Abdullayev explained that the cluster is called upon to become the centre of attraction for scientists, practitioners and decision-makers.

CAREC faces
